

The City Commission for the City of Richmond, Texas met in Special Commission Meeting Session on May 14, 2018 at 4:30 p.m.

Mayor Moore proceeded to call the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m. A quorum was present, with the following members in attendance:

Mayor Moore introduced agenda item A2, Public Comments. No one signed up to speak during this time and the agenda item was closed.

Commissioner Barry Beard made the motion to approve Ordinance No. 2018-06, certifying the General Election Results of May 5, 2018 with Commissioner Lockhart seconding the motion. The vote was unanimous to approve. The agenda item was closed.

Mayor Moore introduced agenda item A5, Oath of Office Given to the Newly Elected Officials, Positions 1 and 3 of the City Commission. City Secretary Laura Scarlato provided the Oath of Office for Position 1 to Terry Gaul, declaring him Commissioner for the City of Richmond. City Secretary Laura Scarlato provided the Oath of Office for Position 3 to Carl Drozd, declaring him once again the Commissioner for the City of Richmond. The terms of these positions will be from May, 2018 to May, 2021 for a three year term. The agenda item was closed.

Mayor Moore proceeded to agenda item A6 and read the proclamation to declare "Peace Officers Memorial Day," May 15th and "National Police Week," May 13th – May 19th. Mayor Moore read the proclamation Honoring the Peace Officers and National Police Week, including the ceremonies that are held in Washington D.C. to honor our fallen heroes of which there were 15 in Texas in 2017.

With no further business to discuss, the Mayor Moore adjourned the meeting at 4:40 p.m.
