How to read and calculate your water meter:

- 1. Take a current reading of the meter. All digits except for the last two digits on the right.
- 2. Using a previous read, subtract the previous reading taken from the current reading.
- 3. Once you have the difference of the two numbers above, add two zeros to the end of the difference.
- 4. This number is the amount of water used between the two readings in gallons.

See example:

Previous reading was: 1539

Current Reading below: 1641

Take current reading: 1641
Subtract previous reading: -1539

102 difference

Add two zeros to the difference: 10200 = Total consumption between readings is 10,200 gallons.

^{*}Check water meters daily or weekly to help determine when most consumption is used.

^{*}For Sprinkler Systems – Take a reading before the sprinkler system turns on and again after it turns off to help determine how much consumption is used each time the sprinklers turn on. Multiply that amount by the number of times watering per month to determine monthly consumption of sprinkler system.
