Mayor Moore introduced agenda item A2, Public Comments. There were no individuals signed up to speak so the agenda item was closed.

Agenda item A3, second Public Hearing to receive comments for and against the limited purpose annexation of the commercial properties in Fort Bend County Municipal Utility District No. 121, being Block One (1) of Williams Crossing, a recording subdivision in Fort Bend County, Texas, and 5.00 acre tract of land, located southwest of the intersection of Williams Way Blvd and Wildwood Park Road. No public comments, agenda item as closed.

Agenda item A4, Review and consider taking action on second and final reading of Resolution No. 174-2017, authorizing funding for the Quiet Zones Project.
